Reception Class: WOW! - The Reception children have been very busy learning all about Chinese New Year. As well as learning some fascinating facts they have made beautiful Chinese fans, Chinese lanterns and even tasted Chinese noodles!

Year 3 and 4 Assembly: WOW! - Year 3 and 4 have been busy learning all about Early Britain. As well as learning some fascinating facts they have been completing cave paintings and have studied different kinds of rocks. All of this culminated in the performance of an outstanding assembly toady. I cannot believe how much you have learnt and discovered as well as all the lines you have memorised! I sure Parents will agree when I say that we are very, very proud of you all! **Fun with Maths:** Our last session was held in the TreeHouse today with children joining their Parents and Grandparents to share their learning. A fantastic response and I hope that you all gathered some valuable ideas! All this will go a significant way to enabling outstanding progress for your children – well done!

Pre-Learning: Over the half-term we will be sending home some pre-learning homework to help support your child/children with their next topic. Homework is a vital and crucial support in your child's learning – if it is used correctly! Standard primary homework has been shown to just have 0.02 as a powerful effect whereas learning that is introduced to children before a topic begins – 'Go and find out about the water-cycle.' – has a 0.93 powerful effect. This type of homework gives children the confidence and knowledge to tackle more interesting concepts! Furthermore, reading with your child followed by a chat about the text both at home and at school has a 0.62 powerful effect so thank you to all of you for your commitment to home reading – it really does have a huge influence on progress! Mrs. Green asks you to keep chanting your times-tables too! **See separate sheet for your holiday tasks – it's up to you how you present it – verbal, written, pictorial – awards will be given!**

Attendance - Our attendance data is very good and we really do appreciate your commitment to ensuring your child is in school. We are aware that there have been a number of illnesses in school during the last term, which impact on your child's attendance. In addition, there may well be exceptional reasons why you need to take your child out of school for a holiday or occasion/event. If that is the case, I strongly encourage you to contact me about it, preferably before any bookings are made. Termly letters are sent to parents/carers to advise you if your child's attendance falls below 97%. Often as the year progresses this can be improved upon very quickly. We are very keen to continue to support our families and ask that you contact us if there is anything we can do to help. If you receive a letter and wish to discuss this further please do not hesitate to contact us. Thank you for your continued support.

PE Lessons: Children take part in two sessions of Physical Education a week – some indoor, some outdoor. **Please ensure your child has the correct PE kit in school**. **Participation in PE is hugely important for the development of health, fitness and wider skills for learning such as resilience and collaboration**. We have noticed a number of children are regularly forgetting their PE kit. All children should bring PE kits at the start of each half term and take them home at the end of the half term to wash.

PE Kit:

• White -t-shirt (with or without logo),

• Purple shorts/black tracksuit bottom/black leggings – due to the colder months and the floor in the church hall we would ask that black tracksuit bottoms/leggings are supplied for PE,

- Purple hoodie (not required),
- Black pumps/sensible trainers.

Thank you to those children who consistently wear the correct PE kit during lessons. Please could we remind you that it is essential for all pupils to wear appropriate kit for their PE lessons to ensure personal hygiene and safety.

During PE lessons children are not allowed to wear jewellery of any kind, including watches, necklaces and earrings, please ensure these can be removed or send in plasters or micro-tape so that small studs can be covered.

Late-stay and Breakfast Club: Please can all parents/carers please ensure that they pass over and sign in and out their child from breakfast club and late-stay. On dark, early mornings it is crucial that children are not entering the school grounds on their own. Thank you for your continued help in ensuring the safety of all our children.

Parent Help Register: Thank you for being so patient. We are having to understand some new data-protection regulations coming into force and we will be with you shortly! Many thanks!

Free School Meals : All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically qualify for universal free school meals. However children in the infants and the juniors may qualify for free school meals because you are in receipt of certain benefits, in which case you need to register your eligibility. If you are eligible your child could qualify for Pupil Premium funding from the Government which will come into school to improve pupil attainment or provide additional opportunities.
