SCHOOL BANK!

Our School Bank takes place in 'The Tree House' every Friday from 2:45pm.

Free School Meals: All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically qualify for universal free school meals. However children in the infants and the juniors may qualify for free school meals because you are in receipt of certain benefits, in which case you need to register your eligibility. If you are eligible your child could qualify for Pupil Premium funding from the Government which will come into school to improve pupil attainment or provide additional opportunities. If you require further information please do not hesitate to contact the office.

School Illness: We would like to inform you that there has been confirmed cases of chicken pox at Rivington; therefore we would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the procedure for when to keep your child at home and when it is appropriate to send them back to school, should your child develop the symptoms of chicken pox.

Our school policy states that if a child is suspected of having chicken pox, parents will be contacted immediately and asked to collect their child from school. All children should remain at home until **all** chicken pox spots have crusted over to

avoid further spread of the illness. Should any child return to school before this time, parents will be contacted and asked to collect them and take them back home.

Can I also inform you that we have had a confirmed case of Scarlet Fever

Maths Pre-Learning!

Do you want to give your child an advantage in their learning in Maths for next week? These activities will help give your child a solid start with next week's learning!

EYFS: Count - steps up the stairs, money into a money box etc. Ask children to say how many without counting (5 or fewer). Play games using a dice and encourage child to say how many spots without counting

The staff have requested that we have a week of times tables practise at home.

Y1/2: 2x, 5x, 10x, 3x and 4x!

Y3/4: 2x, 5x, 10x, 3x, 4x, 6X, 7x, 8x and 9x!

Y5/6: All of the times tables, division facts, square roots, square numbers, fractions of amounts.
