Pupil Planners and Home School Agreements:

Today your child will come home with their School Planner which is an information and communication tool between yourself and the staff in your child's classroom as well as a running record for Home Reading. At the front of this planner you will find the Home School Agreement, permission for photographs and publishing; e-safety agreements and permission for curriculum activities. It is really important that you read all of this information - share it with your child where appropriate and sign where requested. Your agreement to these documents, shown through your signature, is crucial in ensuring the safe running of school life. For example, if the permission for curriculum activities is not signed then your child would not be able to take part in activities outside of school grounds.

Please can you ensure that the planners are signed as soon as possible so that we can record returns on our systems.

The Home School agreement in the planner helps to clarify and define the relationship between home and school and our and your expectations. All of these are designed to make school life the most productive and enjoyable for everyone - whether child, or indeed adult. Remember to value and support the work of the school - this is your child's school, speak proudly of its successes.

If for any reason you wish to discuss queries don't hesitate to call in or make an appointment. As you are already aware, Rivington is an outstanding school, - with the very highest standards of behaviour, independence, and academic levels aimed for at all times.

The Friday 'Get Together'

We will be holding a family 'Get Together' at 9:10 - 9:40 every Friday. Parents are invited to join us for our weekly family assembly and join in our celebrations of the children's hard work - see below!

'Rivington Remarkables' and 'The Seven Wonders'.

Below is a description of our awards certificates given out on alternate weeks in our 'Get Together' assembly.

The first of these is the 'Rivington Remarkables'. This will be awarded to children for demonstrating and using one the four Rivington behaviours for learning - Resilience, Resourcefulness, Reflectiveness and Reciprocity. Further detail on how to develop these behaviours at home will follow.



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The second certificate is the 'Seven Wonders' award. This certificate will be awarded weekly to a child in each year who demonstrates one of our seven core values: kindness, respect, honesty, courage, forgiveness, perseverance and responsibility.

These awards will be given during our Friday 'Get Together' which begins at 9:10 and ends at 9:40am.

The parents of children who are to receive a sticker or award will be notified and text on Thursday afternoon to give you the opportunity to attend our Friday celebrations.

School Uniform:

The uniform is as follows:

White shirt, purple tie, purple jumper/cardigan, grey trousers, purple checked kilt and black shoes with low heels. Girls may wear a summer dress at the appropriate time of year. Sweatshirts with the school logo, kilts and ties are available from **Jada**, **Eaves Lane**, **Chorley**.

PE kits consisting of named white/black T-shirt, purple shorts and pumps should be brought and kept in school in small draw-string PE bags in order to minimise the space taken up in cloakrooms.

No jewellery should be worn other than stud earnings (earnings need to be covered during P.E.) or a watch. Extreme hairstyles are not considered appropriate for school. If in doubt whether a style is unsuitable, contact school prior to having the hair styled.

Please can we remind you to label all uniform and PE kits and make sure children have PE kits in school ready for lessons next week.

School Photographs:

Individual, sibling and class photographs will be taken on **Friday 14th September**. If you have siblings who do not attend this school and want a photograph with your child please come for 2:00pm. Photographs will be taken individually and with siblings as standard.

Adult Helpers:

Do you have a hidden talent that we can utilize in school or would like to offer a 'helping hand' then keep a look out for our parental help register to be sent out shortly. Please note that adult helpers will now need to have a DBS check.



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Books and Games:

If anyone has any unwanted books or traditional board games in good condition we would really appreciate any donations to support class/library reading and wet playtimes. Thank you in advance.

Water Bottles:

Children can bring sports cap water bottles into school so that they have access to a drink in class throughout the day. Please ensure that their name is on the bottle and that they only fill their bottle with natural water.

Our first Open Day for new prospective parents is Wednesday October 10th at 10am until 11am and 1:30pm until 2:30pm. Please contact school if you would like to attend. We look forward to meeting you.

<u>School Admissions- Secondary</u> - Secondary applications can be made on line and you should clearly state 3 preferences for your child. If you are applying to a church school there is a supplementary form which needs to be completed. <u>A reminder that the closing date for Secondary School Admissions is the 31st October 2017.</u>

High School Open Days -Parents of pupils in Years 6 or 5 may wish to attend open evenings being held in our local high schools. St Michael's Thursday 13th September from 5.30pm to 8.00pm, Parklands Thursday 20th September from 5.15pm to 8.15pm, Southlands Monday 17th September from 5.30pm and Albany Thursday 27th September from 5.00pm to 7.00pm.

<u>Dropping Off and Picking Up From School:</u>

The road outside of school is obviously very busy at the start and end of the day. It has been brought to my attention that parents are still picking up and dropping off one the yellow zig-zag lines. These lines are marked to ensure the safety of our children. In the interest of the safety of our children and all pedestrians under no circumstances are vehicles to be parked on the zigzag lines.

Can all parents or family dropping-off/picking up adhere to the speed limits around school/local area and apply patience when attempting to go up and down the road. I



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have contacted the local police who will be carrying out spot-checks on both parking and speed.

Free School Meals:

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically qualify for Universal free school meals. However children in the infants and the juniors may qualify for free school meals because you are in receipt of certain benefits, in which case you need to register your eligibility. If you are eligible your child could qualify for Pupil Premium funding from the Government which will come into school to improve pupil attainment or provide additional opportunities. If you require further information please do not hesitate to contact the office.
