We would be very grateful for any donations of non-perishable items **to brought to school on the day** (in a plastic bag) to support the **Winter Watch** food bank – please see items request in an attached list. We hope you can join us in our celebrations and know the children will really enjoy seeing you there.

School parking and speeding:

Can you please take note of the separate letter addressing these two extremely concerning issues.

Funds for School Building Improvements:

The floor, electrics and heating work in the two ground floor classrooms are being funded through LCC condition led funding. School also have a few years of capital which we are using to support re-decoration of these two rooms and to re-fit the Y1/2 toilets. In short, this is a very expensive project. Unfortunately, we are still short in a few areas so we are hoping that our wonderful families could help support school in even the tiniest way not only to support school improvement but to also help with the funding of:

- New slats for the blinds in Y3/4;
- A new rug for Y1/2;
- A free-standing cupboard for Y1/2;
- New flooring for EYFS;
- A handful of replacement chairs for both rooms.

In order to help support this we were going to complete a Jim-Jam Jog but looking at the space we have (very little) and the logistics of the field (especially with the change of weather) we have decided to move this to later in the year.

In the meantime, we are sending home a tube of Smarties (a little treat – in moderation!) so that the children can complete the 'Smartie Challenge'! Even the smallest donation will make a huge difference! Further details will follow!

School has a clearly defined development plan and much of the work around this utilises the skills, knowledge and abilities we have around us – often pooling resources and training with other schools to ensure value for money. Beyond this and to further support this we always want to aim for the best we can and know that this sometimes may need some financial commitment. With our financial forward planning, fundraising/grant applications this year we will be looking to aim for:

- Further laptops and IPads for KS1;
- A re-fit of the top kitchen;
- Access new outdoor provision for EYFS and KS1;



- A handwriting scheme;
- Clicker writing programme to be used on the laptops/IPads;
- Intervention training for reading and writing;
- Materials for the Art and RE curriculum;
- A re-decoration of Y5/6 and the stairs/entrance way.

PTA Funds:

Can I once again thank the entire PTA and all of you who have supported an event, grant application or crowd funding request. Over the last year School Development has benefitted from:

- £2000 chemistry grant;
- 12x new laptops;
- £1000 for a maths scheme and resources;
- £1500 for history/geography resources;
- £1500 writing project for KS2 3 staff trained for a full year.
- £500 for the Faith Service Level Agreement (SLA);
- £600 for storage in EYFS;
- £500 for 'Mathlectics' computer based homework all year groups;
- £500 pounds for emotional literacy training.

Thank you to you all doesn't seem to cover it – you make such a difference!

Holiday Leave:

Please note our policy on the Leave of Absence. In line with Government instructions, we can no longer authorise Holiday Leave as a matter of course. Government are placing great pressure on school s not to authorise holidays during term times. Both myself and the governors do want to work with parents. We will look at holiday requests which fall into exceptional circumstances and where attendance is above 97.5%. Please read the attendance policy on the website before submitting an application.

The 2019-20 holiday pattern will be available shortly.

Sickness and hair:

If your child is sick or has had diarrhoea please do not send them back to school **for 48 hours** after symptoms have passed.

Your child's hair should be of a natural colour no shorter than a number 2 and contain no steps or lines – sorry! Remember when you chose Rivington you chose our rules as well – we embrace them, we are proud of them – please keep them.

Please do not let your child come to school wearing nail varnish, anything other than stud earrings or trainers.

Primary Admission Information for 2018: Admissions for Reception opened on Monday 4th September. The closing date for Primary School Admissions is Monday 15th January 2018. For information about our admissions criteria please visit the school website. **Please note:** Last year there was a change to our preschool criteria/points. This has had to be made due to direction from LCC Admissions. Please check if you are applying this year.

<u>School Admissions- Secondary</u> - Secondary applications can be made on line and you should clearly state 3 preferences for your child. If you are applying to a church school there is a supplementary form which needs to be completed. <u>A reminder that the closing date for Secondary School Admissions is the 31st October 2017.</u>

High School Open Days –Parents of pupils in Years 6 or 5 may wish to attend open evenings being held in our local high schools. St Michael's Thursday 13th September from 5.30pm to 8.00pm, Parklands Thursday 20th September from 5.15pm to 8.15pm, Southlands Monday 17th September from 5.30pm and Albany Thursday 27th September from 5.00pm to 7.00pm.

Dropping Off and Picking Up From School: The road outside of school is obviously very busy at the start and end of the day. It has been brought to my attention that parents are still picking up and dropping off one the yellow zig-zag lines. These lines are marked to ensure the safety of our children. In the interest of the safety of our children and all pedestrians under no circumstances are vehicles to be parked on the zigzag lines. This is dangerous and could cause an accident. Thank you for your understanding.

Free School Meals: All children in Reception, Year I and Year 2 automatically qualify for Universal free school meals. However children in the infants and the juniors may qualify for free school meals because you are in receipt of certain benefits, in which case you need to register your eligibility. If you are eligible your



child could qualify for Pupil Premium funding from the Government which will come into school to improve pupil attainment or provide additional opportunities. If you require further information please do not hesitate to contact the office.
