# School parking and speeding:

The police and local councillor have been contacted yet again over the on-going issues regarding inconsiderate and- ultimately- extremely dangerous parking by a few individuals. We have been informed that unannounced patrols will now be taking place around the school site and penalties will be issued to anyone who is illegally parked. They are particularly concerned about the traffic parked on Sheep House Lane and cars parked on the entrance to the School and Car park which are presenting an extremely dangerous situation to families and pedestrians attempting to cross the road.

I can fully understand and appreciate what a horrendous situation 'picking up' time is. Like many primary schools – the roads around school were never designed to hold the amount of traffic arriving from 2:45pm onwards. We are looking at ways to elevate the situation but solutions such as a staggered pick-up are difficult when parents have children in different classes and in the end I think it may mean people turning up earlier on the school site. Ultimately what school requests is some sense and co-operation around the situation. My own children's school has similar problems so on the very rare occasion I am able to pick them up I am always willing to park away from the school site and walk. I realise that some of you for various reasons need to park closer to school site and please contact me so that we can look at ways to support you doing this.

I want to once again thank the large majority of our parents who never present any problems when dropping off and picking up. Can I once again request that any issues are reported to the police on 101 so that they can further support school with both parking and speeding.

## **Holiday Leave:**

Please note our policy on the Leave of Absence. In line with Government instructions, we can no longer authorise Holiday Leave as a matter of course. Government are placing great pressure on schools not to authorise holidays during term times. Both I and the governors do want to work with parents. We will look at holiday requests which fall into exceptional circumstances and where attendance is above 97.5%. Please read the attendance policy on the website before submitting an application.

The 2019-20 holiday pattern will be available shortly.



### Sickness and hair:

If your child is sick or has had diarrhoea please do not send them back to school **for 48 hours** after symptoms have passed.

Your child's hair should be of a natural colour no shorter than a number 2 and contain no steps or lines – sorry! Remember when you chose Rivington you chose our rules as well – we embrace them, we are proud of them – please keep them.

Please do not let your child come to school wearing nail varnish, anything other than stud earrings or trainers.

If you require a new tie these are now available in the school office.

Free School Meals: All children in Reception, Year I and Year 2 automatically qualify for Universal free school meals. However children in the infants and the juniors may qualify for free school meals because you are in receipt of certain benefits, in which case you need to register your eligibility. If you are eligible your child could qualify for Pupil Premium funding from the Government which will come into school to improve pupil attainment or provide additional opportunities. If you require further information please do not hesitate to contact the office.
