

Dear Parents,

# **Staffing**

We would like to extend many grateful thanks to Mrs. Alison Green for her hard-work, support and for being a fantastic part of the Rivington team this year. She has given Rivington her wealth of experience and has offered priceless assistance to all the staff and children - especially to myself in my first year of headship. We wish Mrs. Green all the best as she returns back to her school where she has been greatly missed.

We look forward to welcoming Ms. Rachel Cadwallader in September as the new Y5/6 teacher and Deputy Headteacher. Ms. Cadwallader has already made several visits to school and is in this week to prepare her classroom and meet with me. Ms. Cadwallader is extremely excited about joining the Rivington team and all the possibilities it will bring.

I can now confirm which classes our support staff will be working with next year. Reception – Mrs. Orgill, Mrs. Grimal and Mrs. Roberts. Year 1/2 – Mrs. Hodgkinson, Mrs. Hitchen and Mrs. Gell. Year 3/4 – Mrs. Milton and Mrs. Roberts. Year 5/6 – Mrs. Gell, Mrs. Roberts and Mrs. Cliffe. Mrs. Hitchen will also be supporting in the school office.

We are pleased to announce that Mrs. Cliffe will begin her intensive teacher training next year and will lead Y2 and Y5/6 as a teacher for parts of the week under the guidance of Mrs. Cuerden and Myself.

Mrs. Gell and Mrs. Cliffe will also begin their new roles of Learning Mentors to provide pastoral and nurture support for our pupils across school.

**Ms Redmayne –** We continue to wish Ms. Redmayne a speedy recovery – school is not the same without her. Please note that due to continuing treatment, I will not be available for full days in the first three weeks of the term. I will be at school every day but will have to leave a little earlier due to appointments. I am always contactable via email and Ms. Cadwallader, Mrs. Whittaker and Mrs. Davies are available for face-to-face meetings as the Senior Leadership Team. Many thanks for your understanding – school is at the centre of everything I do.

**Building Work** – there are a number of issues with the floor in Y3/4 and Y1/2. Over the years, there have been a number of efforts at remedial fixes but the problems have never 'gone away'. Fortunately School has been able to access 'condition-led funding' from Lancashire County Council which is used to fix issues which will ultimately lead to a school closure – we have all had enough of those! This work is pencilled in to begin during the Summer holidays and if this is the case we may be returning to a site in the middle of a building project in September. Logistical planners have been in School this week to plan the project around the 'everyday' School life we need to return to in September. Obviously, there may be some consequences to the planned work. As a result, if it has started, it may mean re-housing Y1/2 in a portable cabin in the playground and Y3/4 in the hall for the first part of the term. During this time the floor and heating in the bottom classrooms will be replaced.

Please understand that we acknowledge that it is not the best way to start a new year but it is the only way to ensure a safe building for our children. The costs around this job are quite significant so we too have only just received confirmation that it should be going ahead this week and have been frantically packing up the bottom two rooms – a job that is continuing well into next week and one that will require time to set up two new classrooms as we return.

I will keep you posted regarding updates. Many thanks in advance for your patience and understanding.

**PTA** – May I take this opportunity to thank the PTA for all their efforts throughout this year. They have given their time and efforts in the most generous way. Events throughout this year have raised a staggering amount to support school improvement including 12 new laptops, the funding of a year-long writing project, maths scheme and resources, a geography and history scheme, staff nurture training alongside supporting school trips and swimming. We cannot thank you enough. Further details regarding future planning for the PTA will be sent out this week.

**Attendance** - Thank you for your co-operation this year in ensuring that the children come in to school each day, that holidays in term-time are kept to the minimum and for communicating so well with me about any requests. Your support is very much appreciated.
