Decorated eggs

Egg rolling eggs need to be hard boiled and decorated in some way so that the children can recognise their own eggs once they have been rolled. Inevitably the eggs smash as they roll down the hill so maybe these eggs don't need to be a work of art. A spare one never goes amiss either! NO NAIL VARNISH OR PAINT – felt tip is best and only eggs from hens! We are serious about our egg-rolling at Rivington!

Parents are welcome to come and see the egg rolling in the afternoon and view the competition exhibits. After the egg rolling, Celebration (approx 2.30) will be held in the Hall. The half termly achievement awards will be presented and certificates for the winners of the competitions. All parents and grandparents are welcome to join us for these events.
