SATs: As you know in the year 6 and Year 2 children will be taking their National Curriculum Assessments (also known as SATs) this month. These assessments will be for Maths and English.

In the KS2 Maths, there are 3 papers. Paper 1 is an arithmetic paper, which is very similar to those the children are working on. Papers 2 and 3 are reasoning papers where the children will need to solve problems.

In English, there is an English reading test and an English grammar, punctuation and spelling test.

The assessments are sent off for external marking whereas the writing is judged on the work they have produced throughout the year in their theme books.

KS2 SATs week begins on Monday 13th May 2019 this year and there will be assessments on each day of that week excluding Friday. The timetable is as follows:

At school we very much encourage the children to 'try their very best' and to be resilient in their approach even if they find some aspects of the tests challenging. We talk openly and honestly about why these tests are important to them and to us as a school. It is a time when the children can really show their learning and celebrate their successes in the core areas of Maths and English.

Both the Y6 and Y2 children have worked really hard and have shown great maturity and resilience during the past few weeks. We are very proud of them. So that your child can do their best next week, please ensure that they get lots of rest this weekend and get to bed at a reasonable hour the night before each test. Please encourage your child to eat sensibly each day.

We would like Year 6 pupils to attend school at 8:30am from Monday to Thursday next week. We will be providing a breakfast club free of charge, where children can enjoy a relaxed breakfast together to ensure that they start the day in a positive way. Please ensure that your child arrives promptly at school so that they are fully prepared before the tests commence.

Sports Day: ALL CHANGE! SAVE THE DATE! This will take place on the morning of **Thursday 4th July at Albany Academy High School, Bolton Road, Chorley**. We are lucky to have accessed these wonderful facilities and we will be assisted by Chorley Schools Sports Partnership which should mean that the children and our families will have a wonderful experience. The event will take place during the morning and parents are invited to attend. Albany is allowing school to stay at the venue for the full day but with no families in the afternoon so that we can make further use of their wonderful sports facilities. We are hoping that this means that the children can be dropped off and picked-up using the same kind of arrangements school had in place during our stay at the school last summer. Further details of the final arrangements and logistics to follow soon.

PE Kit: Every class from Reception to Year 6 has two lessons of PE a week and there is a timetable of when their lessons are. However, there needs to be some flexibility due to PE lessons sometimes having to change days (for reasons such as World Day, school trips, productions, provision that term or adverse weather). We therefore always ask that PE kits be taken home on a Friday and brought back into school on a Monday. This means that your child should never miss a single PE lesson!

Can I also remind parents that school PE kit includes: purple shorts, black tracksuit bottoms, purple hoodie (optional), white t-shirt and black PE pumps or trainers. Children should not be wearing sportswear with logos.

Attendance: The happiness and educational progress of all our children are our main priorities and we believe that good attendance is a major way in which these priorities can be achieved. The pace of the curriculum is such that when your child is away from school, the learning they miss will significantly have an effect on future learning and can often not 'be made up'. Rivington Foundation Primary School follows Lancashire County Council guidelines regarding authorised and unauthorised absences. We monitor attendance every term and we will write to you if your child's attendance falls below 95%. At this stage in the year if this is due to illness this figure often increases as we progress through the year. **If your child's attendance falls below 90% this is classed as persistent absence and in these cases we would like to support you as much as possible which may include meeting together to discuss the best way to support you.** We ask for your support in this matter and if you would like any advice in relation to attendance please do not hesitate to contact school.
