Explorers

English

Throughout the half term the children will have the opportunities to write a variety of different text types. Our unit for this half term is reading fiction text by the same author – Simon Bartram, closely focussing on The Man on the Moon. Ultimately, we are going to write 'our own version' of the story for other classes in school to read. Also we are focusing on non-fiction texts about space. The children will collate their information pages to make a class non-fiction book for our library.

Text: The Man on the Moon + Space facts

Maths

In Maths we will be using mastery approach through power maths to cover the following;

Year 2: Addition and subtraction, money, multiplication and division, statistics, length and height, properties of shape and fractions

Year 1: 2D and 3D shapes, numbers to 20, addition and subtraction within 20, numbers to 50, height and length weight and volume

The Big Picture

This term is a science and geography based unit where we will study exploration in space and around our world. We will be studying human and physical geography, considering how they affect people's lives in a specific locality. There will be links across English, Maths, and DT.
