


**COVID-19:** In the event that somebody in your household wakes up with a fever (>37.8°C), or a new, continuous cough or a loss of the sense of smell or taste do not send your child to school. Please inform the school via phone or email (bursar@rivington.lancs.sch.uk/head@rivington.lancs.sch.uk) and then book a test for the person. The whole household must then self-isolate. If the test returns negative and nobody has any ongoing symptoms, the child can return to school and the household no longer needs to self-isolate. If a positive result is returned, the



household must self-isolate for 14 days but the positive case can resume normal activity after 10 days as long as they have been symptom free for 48 hours.

Christmas Jumper Day: Get your Christmas outfits/Jumpers ready for Friday 11<sup>th</sup> December as we celebrate our annual Christmas Jumper in order to raise money for Save the Children. All the children are invited to wear their Christmas outfits and donate a £1. Many thanks in advance.

**EU Settlement Scheme:** Could I please bring to your attention the following information regarding the EU Settlement Scheme:

If you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, you and your family can apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 30 June 2021. You can also apply if you're the family member of <u>an eligible person of Northern Ireland</u>.

If your application is successful, you'll get either settled or pre-settled status. The EEA includes the EU countries and also Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway.

You may be able to <u>stay in the UK without applying</u> - for example, if you're an Irish citizen or already have indefinite leave to remain.

## When you can apply

The EU Settlement Scheme is open. You can <u>apply now</u> if you meet the criteria. The deadline for applying is 30 June 2021. You must have started living in the UK by 31 December 2020.

Which status you get may depend on when you apply.

Except in a few cases, you need to apply if:

- you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen
- you're <u>not an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen</u>, but your family member is (or is an eligible person of Northern Ireland)

This means you need to apply even if you:

- were born in the UK but are not a British citizen you can <u>check if you're a British</u> <u>citizen</u> if you're not sure
- have a UK 'permanent residence document'
- are a family member of an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen who does not need to apply including if they're from Ireland
- are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen with a British citizen family member

If you have children, you <u>need to apply for them separately</u>. If you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen and you have a family member who is an eligible person of Northern Ireland, <u>you may be able to choose which way you apply</u>.
