- the joy and smiles that only Christmas in at Rivington can bring;


- a happy and healthy end to the term;

School re-opens on Monday 4th of January. Our staggered starts and ends will remain as they are.

Procedures for Parents/Carers regarding symptoms of a child/staff member at school after school closes on the 18th December.

Please follow the procedure below regarding positive cases after the last day of term:

- Parents/Carers and Rivington School Staff must contact school via the details below if symptoms of Covid-19 emerge within 48 hours of pupils/Rivington staff being in school.
- Parents must ONLY contact school on 07794743232 or at head@rivington.lancs.sch.uk. Messages should not be left on the School phone as this will not be checked on a daily basis. Messages left via the two ways listed will be checked between 9-11am each day.
- Messages will be checked by Mrs. Annette up until and including the 24th December.
- Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted.
 Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.



- For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school will, via the contacts above, assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the pupil/staff member may have been infectious whilst in school.
- Mrs. Annette will not remain on-call or conduct any contact tracing more than 6 days after the final day of teaching.
- Rivington's last teaching day is on Friday 18th December, there will be no pupil contact tracing asks through school beyond Thursday 24th December.
- Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a
 positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term,
 school does not need to be informed about their absence until
 the first day of the new term.

Pupil Premium: Are you entitled? If you find that your circumstances have changed recently due to the COVID pandemic you may be entitled to Pupil Premium. If you are, then you could get help towards payments for trips and Free School Meals for your child. It's easy to do. All you need to do is call the South Area Education Office on 01772 532109 or click on the link https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-educationfamilies/schools/free-school-meals/?page=3 It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings. You will need to provide your name, date of birth and National Insurance Number. They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone. Alternatively complete the form and hand into the school office. Pupil Premium is completely confidential and other pupils and families will not know if you gain access to the funding.

Christmas Cards To minimise any potential C-19 transmission between our numerous households we would politely request that Christmas cards are not sent into school and between classes or bubbles. Our older children usually manage the sorting and delivery of the many hundreds of Christmas cards in school but this year they are not able to travel around the school. Consequently, we will not be hosting our traditional post box in the corridor or running special deliveries to classrooms to protect year group bubbles.

Children will still be given the opportunity to make Christmas cards in school for family members and will be stored safely for the appropriate time-scales in accordance with current DfE guidance, before being sent home.

EU Settlement Scheme: Could I please bring to your attention the following information regarding the EU Settlement Scheme:

If you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, you and your family can apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 30 June 2021. You can also apply if you're the family member of <u>an eligible person of Northern Ireland</u>.

If your application is successful, you'll <u>get either settled or pre-settled status</u>. The EEA includes the EU countries and also Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway.

You may be able to <u>stay in the UK without applying</u> - for example, if you're an Irish citizen or already have indefinite leave to remain.

When you can apply

The EU Settlement Scheme is open. You can <u>apply now</u> if you meet the criteria. The deadline for applying is 30 June 2021. You must have started living in the UK by 31 December 2020.

Which status you get may depend on when you apply.

Except in a few cases, you need to apply if:

- you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen
- you're <u>not an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen</u>, but your family member is (or is an eligible person of Northern Ireland)

This means you need to apply even if you:

- were born in the UK but are not a British citizen you can <u>check if you're a British</u> <u>citizen</u> if you're not sure
- have a UK 'permanent residence document'
- are a family member of an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen who does not need to apply including if they're from Ireland
- are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen with a British citizen family member

If you have children, you need to apply for them separately.

If you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen and you have a family member who is an eligible person of Northern Ireland, you may be able to choose which way you apply.

Reporting an Illness: If your child is poorly, please contact the school to let us know as soon as possible and keep us updated. It is important that when leaving a message that all parents/carers please inform us of the reason/symptoms for the absence. If a Parent/Carer is reporting a positive test result can you, please speak to



the office rather than leave a message. This week we have sent all parents/carers a useful 'COVID-19 Quick Guide' and key question responses to help if you may suspect your child has COVID-19 symptoms and what action to take. We are very appreciative for all our families taking these necessary precautions and helping to continue to keep our children, our staff and our families safe and well. Thank you.
