# Message from the Speaker of the House of Commons – Sir Lindsay Hoyle

'I am delighted to advise you that The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition (QCEC) is now open for entries and I ask that you encourage schools in your constituency to enter.



The QCEC, delivered by the Royal Commonwealth Society, is the world's oldest international writing competition for schools. It offers thousands of young people, whatever their background, the opportunity to make their voices heard on a global platform. In this Platinum Jubilee year of our Sovereign, Her Majesty The Queen, young Commonwealth writers are asked to reflect on inspirational leadership and to explore the positive impact that can be achieved through commitment to their communities within the theme 'Our Commonwealth'.

Open to all UK residents, aged 18 and under, the competition has two age categories for those aged 14 – 18 years, and those under 14 years. Winners from each category will win a trip to London for a week of educational and cultural activities, culminating in an awards ceremony, usually held at Buckingham Palace and hosted by the Society's Vice-Patron, Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Cornwall. All successful entries are recognised for their participation.

The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition will close for submissions on the 30 June 2022 so I encourage you to consider engaging schools in your constituency in this wonderful opportunity. I have attached relevant information to help you do this, including a flyer about the competition and a draft letter to headteachers. School respectfully asks Parents/Carers/Grandparents not to park on the Church driveway opposite school. **Covid – 19 UPDATE:** Unfortunately positive COVID cases in school are rising. If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19 or a positive test result, Public Health advice is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

School guidelines are:

- Stay at home and self-isolate (from start of symptoms or positive test)
- Test on days 5 and 6. Once your child has had two negative test results they can return to school. Children can return to school after 10 days even if their test is reading positive.

It is advisable to test your child if they become ill as the common symptoms of a positive test that have been reported to us are: High temperature, Cough, Sore throat, Headache, Runny nose, Nausea and Vomiting.

If you live with or have been in contact with someone who has tested positive, you are no longer advised to do daily rapid lateral flow tests and you do not need to isolate. Please follow the guidance below for testing
