

Congratulations to Y6: Well done to our Y6 pupils who, after 2 years of huge disruption, managed to achieve a combined Reading, Writing and Maths of 80%! This is fantastic compared to the national average of 59%. Here is a further comparison with us and the national averages:

- 59% of pupils met the expected standard in all of reading, writing and maths, down from 65% in 2019. School achieved 80%!
- 74% of pupils met the expected standard in reading, up from 73% in 2019. **School achieved 93%!**
- 71% of pupils met the expected standard in maths, down from 79% in 2019. **School achieved 80%!**
- 69% of pupils met the expected standard in writing, down from 78% in 2019. **School achieved 80%!**
- 72% of pupils met the expected standard in grammar, punctuation and spelling, down from 78% in 2019. School achieved 80%!
- 79% of pupils met the expected standard in science, down from 83% in 2019. School achieved 93%!

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Sparkle Day: On Monday we held a 'Sparkle Day' to raise money for the 'Sparkle Bean Charity' in memory of Saffie Rose Roussos a former pupil of Tarleton Community Primary School who was tragically killed in the Manchester Arena attack in 2017. Monday would have been Saffie's 14th birthday.

'Sparkle Day' day raised money for the charity and it was a day for the teachers and children to focus on having fun and celebrating the innocence of childhood! It was a fantastic way to come together to raise money for a good cause and remember a young life in a positive way.

Children and staff joined together to wear sparkly outfits, sparkly hairstyles, sparkly face paints and even had sparkly tattoos.

Thank you to everyone for your support and generosity for this valuable cause. The money raised will go to the Sparkle Bean Trust which is a new charity that aims to support primary schools with advice and grants following the sudden death of a pupil, so that school communities are supported.


