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Toast on a Friday: Toast will be sold for 20p a slice every Friday for the children. We will also be starting a healthy tuck shop after half-term which will run every day apart from Friday. Homework: This year as we aim to make our homework policy even more consistent across school. Our focus will be on reading, spellings and times tables. Your child's weekly tasks will be sent on a standarised sheet which we will share with you after half-term. Children will continue to have their reading records and banded books which are sent home every week. Please do aim to listen to your child read every night: it really does make a huge difference in terms of their progress, and applies to children of all ages. **WATCH OUT FOR OUR WEEKLY READING CHALLENGES COMING NEXT TERM!** A Rivington Parent has again made the school aware that they have witnessed recent incidents of **dangerous driving** around school opening and closing times **these include a minor accident, near misses and incidents of speeding.**

This is a **strong plea** to please take extra care around school which is a **20mph zone** – even at 20 mph there is a three carlength stopping distance and a serious risk of a child being seriously hurt or worse. **Uppermost in our minds is the safety of our pupils.** Watching for Wonders! After half-term we are introducing our 'Watching for Wonders' Book. When any adult in school spots any child doing something 'Wonderful' – based around our school values – our 'Seven Wonders', they may write about it in the 'Watching for Wonders' Book. This will include staff! We will announce the names in the book each week during 'Get Together'.



Morning Start: The school gates open for Y1-6 at 8:45am and then the children can go into school from 8:45- 9:00am. 9:00am is still the official start time so the children need to be in school by then. Thank you for your support in ensuring the children are in school on time – it really is so important for so many reasons. Socially, and academically, this helps them to settle into class, ready for the day ahead. By being just 5 minutes late each day actually equates to $3\frac{1}{2}$ days of learning being missed every year. Naturally, and understandably, things do happen and please don't worry about that. However, it is essential that persistent lateness cannot happen and as we have a duty of care for our children from 9:00am it may become a safeguarding issue. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.



Holiday Requests - We really do value your support in not taking holidays in term time. In summary, I am unable to authorise term-time absence unless it is an exceptional circumstance. If you have any questions about this, please just ask. There may well be an exceptional reason why you may need to take your child out of school and all I ask is for you to contact me about it. Should a request need to be made, we have a short form that needs to be completed and returned, so that we have the details in writing – these are available from the school office. **Headteachers have now been instructed not to make allowances for any COVID-related holiday changes any longer**, so this will no longer be accepted. We kindly request that forms are handed in at least **a month** prior to a planned holiday.

'Living Life to its Fullest ; Making a difference Along the Way' Medicines in School - If medicine needs to be taken under exceptional circumstances, then we are happy to administer this if there has been a written agreement made with parents and the appropriate form from the office completed. This is primarily for prescribed medication. However, again in exceptional circumstances and following the previously mentioned procedures, we will also give Calpol, etc. if there is a real need. Please note that this is not routine. In order to administer this we require that it is provided in the form of a sealed sachet that has the exact amount in and is labelled with the child's name by the chemist. These are readily available from chemists.

First Aid The vast majority of our staff are first aid trained and we have members of staff assigned outside to first aid at breaktimes and lunch. This means that instead of coming straight to the office the children are looked at straight away and basic first aid may be administered, eg. cleaning a graze, putting a plaster on, etc. All the staff do a fantastic job if the children are sent in to be looked at. Accident forms are sent home if we feel necessary, and always following a bumped head, but may not be completed if the injury is deemed very minor and has caused your child no distress. In addition, we ask children who have had a bump to the head to wear a band on their arm in order to ensure that all adults are aware of the incident and keep an eye on them.

Free School Meals/ Pupil Premium: All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically qualify for Universal Free School meals. However, children in the infants and the juniors may qualify for free school meals because you are in receipt of certain benefits, in which case you need to register your eligibility. If you are eligible your child could qualify for Pupil Premium funding from the Government which will come into school to improve pupil attainment or provide additional opportunities. If you require further information, please do not hesitate to contact the office.

Reminder: Fruit ONLY Snacks/NUT ALLERGY - As we are a healthy school and we are educating and promoting healthy lifestyles to our children, fruit and vegetable only snacks are allowed for break times from September. <u>Toast will also be available at 20p per slice on</u> <u>Fridays – orders taken on Thursdays.</u> Please could you also ensure that your child does not bring any food into school that CONTAINS NUTS as we do have a child and staff member with a nut allergy in school. Thank you for your cooperation.
